"Now therefore revere the LORD, and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness [...] choose this day whom you will serve." Joshua 24:14-15



The beginning of a new year is a time when many of us reflect on the year that has been and make resolutions for the year that will be. I'd like to offer you some of my personal reflections as your pastor on the year ahead for Faith Church and invite you to begin the New Year with an old Methodist resolution.

We know that this will be a significant year in the history of Faith UMC. In the first few months we will make decisions as a congregation about the first new building addition in almost 50 years. God willing, we will break ground later in the year.

This is an awesome time to be part of the church. The decisions we make now will shape the disciple-making ministry of the gospel at Faith for years to come. In order to make this vision a reality, we as a congregation are going to be asked to step up in our commitment and faith in ways that we never have before. I can't wait to see what God will do through us as we pray 'not my will, but Your will be done.'

Please put the date of the next informational meetings on your calendar. Saturday, January 21 following the 5:30 worship service and Sunday, January 22 following the 9:45 service. We will share an updated design of the addition, give updates on the process and answer questions.

That brings me to the resolution. As men and women in the Methodist tradition, we have a history of recommitment and resolution at the beginning of the new year called a Covenant Renewal Service. John Wesley first began this service around 1755 and it became common for Methodists to practice it on New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, or the first Sunday of the New Year. In this service, the people are commended to remember God's claim on their lives and to recommit to going 'all in' for God.

Come to worship before you ring in the new year at our regular 5:30 Saturday service with a message from Pastor Rusty about beginning 2017 with purpose. New Year's Day there will be one 9:00 am combined service. <u>There will be no</u> <u>Hands On Bible Club</u>, but the nursery (up to age 2) will be open.

The service takes seriously our human inclination to forget who we are and whose we are. It also makes clear that the transforming work of God in our life and in our world requires partnership with the work of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit invites us to 'work out' what God is 'working in' us (Phil. 2:12-13). This 'working out' requires our clear commitment that God's will would be done and not our will.

The prayers in the service are radical statements of total commitment to God's work in us. Wesley knew that there was no resolution that we could make to begin the New Year that had more potential to bring positive change to ourselves, our families, and our world. I invite you, as this year begins, to do at least one part of the service – the Covenant Prayer. For this moment in the life of our congregation, no prayer could be more important. Cut it out and put it on your nightstand, in your Bible, or on your refrigerator. Read it, pray it, and meditate on it. Recommit this year to be 'all in' for God. Let's see what God may do in your life, and in the life of our congregation. May God bless you as you open yourself to God in this new year.

From Our Facilities Manager - David Miller

As we celebrate the New Year, we look back on some accomplishments in the care and upkeep of our facilities here at Faith Church from 2016.

You may have noticed that the roof over the Sanctuary and Narthex has a new look. This summer, layers of polyurethane coating were applied to stem the numerous leaks that had developed over the years and prevent new ones, as well as better insulate the building from the cold and heat.

With the transitioning of Pastors, this summer was an opportune time to do repairs and renovation to the parsonage, including replacing the well-worn carpet and repainting many of the rooms.

Some of the more visible items on the outside of the church that needed attention were attended to. The white cross on the front of the building was repainted and the bell tower was cleaned of built-up dirt and mineral deposits. New mulch was placed in the flower beds, signs, and around many trees to help keep the grounds looking neat and attractive.

In addition, fire alarms and building safety improvements will also be added to make the current facilities as well as the new addition more secure. 


