#### Pastor's Pen - Lent: It's Not What's in Your Bellybutton

The Christian Church has a seasonal calendar all of its own. The Christian seasons have nothing to do with the weather and have everything to do with experiencing the story of Jesus more fully and knowing Jesus more deeply. Lent is a season of 40 days (excluding Sundays), leading up to Easter. This season traditionally was a time for converts to prepare for baptism on Easter and for all Christians to renew their faith and experience the joy, power, and mystery of the resurrection on Easter. Easter will be on April 16 this year, and the season of lent begins on Wednesday, March 1. This season we invite you to do a few things to renew and

deepen your faith.

Encounter Jesus in the Gospel of Mark: Take the challenge to read through the book of Mark with your friends at Faith Church. The reading plan is on the next page in the newsletter. The sermons each weekend March 11-12 through April 15-16 will be from the reading for the past week. You can also join the Facebook discussion group "FaithUMC Encountering Jesus Discussion Group". This is a place to post any questions you have about Jesus and the Bible and join in discussion with me and others. We hope you will have a fresh experience of who Jesus is as we read the gospel together.

Ash Wednesday Worship: The first day of Lent is traditionally called Ash Wednesday based on the practice of placing ashes on our foreheads as part of worship. The ashes are meant to remind us of our mortality and sin so that we might have a deeper appreciation of the gift of resurrection Ach Swednesday and forgiveness that we celebrate at Easter. For many people this is a powerful way to prepare for Easter. The service is Wednesday March 1 at 7:00 pm.




Holy Week Worship: Plan now to be part of special worship experiences on the Thursday and Friday before Easter. The Thursday service we remember Jesus' last supper with His disciples and share in communion. The Friday service we focus on what Jesus' death on the cross means for us.

Choose a Spiritual Discipline: Sometimes people give something up for Lent which can be a freeing spiritual practice when we stop doing something that we have lost control over. Another idea is to add a new spiritual discipline or practice. Maybe you would like to try fasting once a week, a new prayer practice, an act of service each week, gratitude journaling, or something else. Consider what might help renew your focus on Christ.

How will you prepare yourself over the next 40 days to experience the joy, power, and resurrection of Jesus in fresh ways this Easter? I'd love to hear what you find meaningful. Grateful as always to be on this journey with Jesus with you.

#### ENCOUNTERING JESUS Lent 2017 Reading Plan for Mark

Two billion people claim to follow him... 70,000 books have been written about him... Entire civilizations have been shaped by him... Who Is This Man, Jesus?

**<u>READ</u>**: Through the 40 days of Lent, your challenge is to read through the Gospel of Mark. It is the oldest of the four gospels in the Bible. We will read to see Jesus Christ through the eyes of some of his earliest followers. Ultimately Mark's Gospel was written to reveal the identity of Jesus. Each narrative in this gospel answers the question, "Who is this man?" Discover for yourself who this man is.

**CONNECT:** Your personal reading will help you connect with the sermons which will be from the previous week's church-wide reading plan. Pastor Jake will also facilitate an online Facebook discussion group titled *"FaithUMC Encountering Jesus Discussion Group"*, so that you can ask questions and join in conversations with others about what you are reading. You can search Facebook to find it or look for the links from the main Faith Facebook page. Maybe you will decide to use these readings as the basis for your discussion in a small group or family discussion.

**<u>GROW</u>**: Ultimately we hope that reading along will help you grow closer to God through Jesus Christ this Lenten season as we prepare to celebrate the resurrection. Below are some suggestions about how to open yourself to spiritual growth.

**Pray as you read.** Prayer opens us to the presence of the Holy Spirit through whom God speaks to us in our reading. This is one prayer you can use before you read. (UMH #602)

Blessed Lord, You have caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning. Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which You have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever. Amen.

**Reflect through journaling or discussion.** Responding to what you read really helps you to grow. Journaling is great to do individually or find someone to discuss the reading with. Here are four questions you can use.

- 1. What does this say about who Jesus is?
- 2. What does this say about being a follower/disciple of Jesus?
- 3. What is God saying to me through the scripture?
- 4. What am I going to do about it?



#### Orange Spotlight

In February, our HOBC lessons were all about the love of Christ! Our next theme is really a continuation of that conversation as we discover that FORGIVENESS is a part of love. Every one of us needs forgiveness, from the tiny child who shoves a friend, to the person whose unkind words have hurt a loved one, to the person convicted of murder serving a life sentence behind bars. We all have sin in our lives and relationships in need of repair. During the month of March our kids will learn that despite our sin God's love for us is so great that He forgave us and actually died to save us from sin's destruction. Romans 5:8 tells us that "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Our elementary students will learn about the gift of God's grace and discuss what it means to forgive others because we have been forgiven. Our preschoolers will learn that Jesus tells us to love others and from His example He shows us how to do this even though it can be difficult. I pray that these lessons will stay with our children as they grow so that they will know joy, peace, and freedom in Christ, remembering that if we belong to Christ nothing can separate us from His love.
